

The Delaware SWCD has been appointed by the Delaware County Commissioners to conduct the inspections required for Drainage Review Permits and to make evaluations about what, if any, alterations are necessary to prevent or correct any adverse effects that a proposed new construction may have on existing surface or subsurface drainage.

DRAINAGE REVIEW PERMIT CHANGES



All changes will be enforced starting January 1, 2024



All lots greater than 1 acre that are not in a platted subdivision (including CADs) will require a Drainage Review Permit



A plot plan of the proposed development should be submitted with the application. If a plan is not available, a map will be provided for the applicant to sketch the proposed development.

Development Activity Includes:



Any activity that changes the footprint of the current lot development and requires a building permit.
