Pollinators

Pollinators affect our lives in many positive ways. They help support wildlife, and aid in creating healthy watersheds. Pollinators are animals that fertilize plants by moving pollen from the male structures, called anthers, of flowers to the female structure, called stigma, of the same species. It is estimated that pollinators are responsible for helping more than 75% of the world's flowering plants to reproduce.
