

Do you know or are you a teacher or educator looking to improve and expand conservation education opportunities at your school? We might be able to help!

Our new Educator Mini-Grant program offers educators the chance to apply for 1 of 4 conservation education tools to be used in their classrooms or implemented at their schools. The application is available online from March 1 to June 9, 2024. All awards will be presented prior to September 1, 2024. The number of awards given will be subject to the funding availability.

One of the options that educators can request are butterfly release



kits. They can apply for up to 4 kits for their school/classroom. Each kit includes 5 caterpillars with food needed to grow into Painted Lady Butterflies, a mesh habitat, feeder and dropper, and journal. Another option for educators to apply for is an EnviroScape model. There are numerous model options to choose from and can be used in classrooms from preschool to advanced high school courses. Up to 2 rain barrel kits are an option that help collect and store rainwater from rooftops. The final option to choose from for this mini-grant program is up to 1-acres worth of Ohio blend wildflowers to be planted on or around school grounds. All of these come with sample lesson ideas and teachers are welcome to reach out to us for help in installation and planning if they so desire.

Only one application per education establishment will be accepted. Grant applications will be reviewed by Delaware SWCD staff with final approval of the Delaware SWCD Board of Supervisors.

Solar Eclipse Resources

On April 8, 2024 a solar eclipse will cross the majority of Delaware County. This event will likely increase tourism, interrupt traffic patterns, cause health and safety concerns, and disrupt the normal behaviors of wildlife, pets, and livestock animals.

Residents and visitors are encouraged to prepare for this rare celestial event by taking necessary precautions. Specialized viewing glasses will be essential to safeguard your eyes during the eclipse. Additionally, it is advisable to plan for potential travel delays and increased crowds in popular viewing areas. In order to minimize the impact on pets, it may be helpful to create safe spaces for them indoors during the eclipse.

By staying informed and making thoughtful preparations, everyone can safely enjoy the awe-inspiring moment when the moon briefly obscures the sun on Monday April 8, 2024.

Delaware SWCD Scholarship

The Delaware Soil and Water Conservation District will award one (1) five-hundred-dollar (\$500.00) scholarship for the academic year 2024-2025.

Applicants must be a Delaware County resident, or have graduated or be graduating from one of the Delaware County public or private high schools. At the time of application, the applicant must have achieved at least a 2.5 grade average on a 4.0 scale.

Applicants must be entering his/her first year as a full-time or part-time student at a two or fouryear accredited college, technical school or university, or entering his/her first year of Graduate school. Applicants must be pursuing a degree in agriculture, natural resources, or a similar environmental studies discipline.

LOOKING FOR SIGNS OF SPRING? YOU MIGHT SEE SOME OF THESE THIS WEEK IN YOUR SEARCH FOR SPRING FLOWERS.

ERYTHRONIUM ALBIDUM, COMMONLY KNOWN AS WHITE TROUT LILY, IS A COMMON OHIO NATIVE FLOWER THAT CAN BE FOUND IN DELAWARE COUNTY. THIS PERENNIAL BLOOMS EARLY IN THE SPRING SEASON, AND IS COMMONLY FOUND IN CLUSTERS ON THE WOODLAND FLOOR. YOU WILL FIND THEM IN FULL TO PARTIAL SHADED AREAS.
